Junior's Report

On behalf of everyone at the NWMCA - a big thanks to all Clubs, Junior Coordinators, Coaches and Parents for getting the kids playing cricket. It's a difficult job putting together cricket teams, getting grounds sorted; making sure the training is interesting and then taking the kids all around the place so everyone get a game of cricket; so well done to everyone who helped out over the past season.

A special thanks to everyone on the junior committee who have given up their time to help make sure things run smoothly, the NWMCA Board members and Cricket Victoria.

If it felt like a very long cricket season that's because we had so many things happen in the broader cricket world over the 2014-2015 season.

- The tragic death of Phil Hughes at the start of the season. This event was like nothing else in living memory for the game. Many NWMCA clubs and team organized special tributes on the games played just after Phil Hughes passed away and showed great respect for a fallen fellow cricketer.
- The great cricket played by the Australians over the normal international season which captivated the cricket lovers.
- The fantastic, but long, World Cup. The Aussies well deserved winners but many other teams played extraordinary cricket, like New Zealand. If anyone got to a few games at the MCG the atmosphere was electric.
- Finally at the end of the season we had the passing of Richie Benaud, many of us had grown up with Richie and he will be greatly missed.
- In the middle of all this we had lots of junior cricket being played in the North West of Melbourne.

Some of the highlights from our Junior 2014-15 season were;

- A large diversity of clubs had teams make the finals and grand finals, which is really encouraging to see. A few seasons back it was reasonably predictable which clubs would make the grand finals but this has changed. This is really encouraging as it shows that clubs are making progress with their teams and players.
- More teams wanting to play Friday night games and the implementing of three under 12 and one under 14 Friday night competition. With more teams wanting to play Friday night for a number of reasons we have implemented the compulsory use of orange balls and next season we will introduce more structured playing times for early and late season games to cater for less light.
- The continued growth of our under 10's competition which is resulted in record number of team entering this competition.

- The further adaption of split innings format games with players and coaches getting use to how these games operate. This is something we may look to introduce across all grades for 2 day games
- A mid-week girls competition at Fairbairn Park with players from many clubs making up teams to have a really enjoyable time. A very special thanks to Rob Moore for getting this project off the ground. This competition will continue next season and may expand.
- The continued roll out of Cricket Australia's T20 blast program which is catering for kids between Milo into Cricket and our under 10's. This program was relatively successful for this region as unlike other regions we have a very strong soft ball under 10's competition.

The NWMCA is lucky to a group of skilled and dedicated people that help run the association and make sure cricket games are played in the right spirit. We often are making changes to try and improve our sport as we live in a world where other sports are always competing against Cricket so if we are staying still we will be over taken by other sports. There are many challenges but we are confident that we have the right team that is willing to make changes for the better of our game.

The NWMCA Junior Committee welcomes feedback from clubs and individuals and we encourage those interested in further improving our competition to engage with the Committee.

VMCU Representative Cricket

This year we saw the introduction of an under 18 team and an under 12 girls team into the Rep Cricket. Over the past few years we have gone from 5 teams to now having 8 teams which calls for more resources to get these teams together. We continue to have an approach of opportunity and development of our players and coaches rather than a win at all costs mentality. Whilst our focus is not to be ultra-competitive we still had good success across the 8 teams with 4 teams making finals, the under 18 and under 12 Mitchell shield made grand finals.

Administration Manager's Report

Another season over and the amalgamated association is truly operating as its own identity. Thanks to David the finances are looking healthy.

We now have a full complement of teams in Luscombe Shield and both Kyte and Stringer are predominately clubs 1st X1 sides which augers well for the future. The number of teams playing at senior level has remained static, but we have seen a jump in numbers in the juniors, especially in the under 10's and the under 12's. Fewer than 12 and under 14 games played on a Friday night proved to be a popular move, which looks to increase in the coming season as clubs see the popularity of the timeslot. Thanks must go to Daniel Trevillian and Wayne Shultz for the great work they have put in promoting cricket in the region. The juniors had 26 different clubs competing in grand finals with 16 of them winning premierships, including two tied matches and two that were decided by one run. Peter who did a great job of grading and featuring the juniors must be praised. Stephen Milne who umpired one tie and one run game claimed it was his brilliant strategy for both results. Next season will see the introduction of a girl's competition with a number of clubs indicating that they have willing and capable players. A girl's competition helps the association's standing as girls participation in sport is being actively promoted by councils as well as state and federal governments.

Congratulations to Darrell and Eric for the umpires. NWMCA has the best quality and quantity of umpires and is the envy of other associations. Our unique junior umpire program only gets better with most junior games now with an independent umpire.

Three players had the distinction of playing 400 games of cricket, congratulations to Rod Ebbage, Ray Finn and Gerard Laffan. The association has decided to award grand final medals named after these players in honour of this achievement. The old stager Barry Clissold played his 600th match and also his 400th match with Buckley Park.

Recently C.V. set up a task force looking at the structure of turf cricket which received a mixed reception. Subbies are happy with their format and want to continue as a standalone competition as well as Mercantile. VTCA have also opted not to join, but many of their clubs were happy with the concept. Much of the comment against the proposal centered on the fact that Premier cricket should have been included to make it a genuine review.

At the moment hard wicket competitions and juniors are not included but it was expected that they would align with the new regions. This is probably not feasible and will require hard wicket comps to be looked at in their own right as they have their own unique characteristics.

Lastly thanks to the many people who volunteer valuable time that makes any association function, your help and guidance is greatly appreciated.

Director of Umpiring Report

Open Age Panel

Season 2014/15 was a year of growth for both the Junior and Senior umpiring panels.

The senior panel, with an influx of new umpires, totalled 42 with several others umpiring occasionally.

The season had a high number of umpires unavailable every round. This extended through to the Grand Finals matches when five of our top dozen umpires could not be appointed.

Match Appointments

All Luscombe Shield matches had 2 umpires and the regular rotation of senior umpires between grades continued. New umpires were initially appointed with experienced colleagues to assist new umpire skills training.

Captains' reports are the key factor in grading umpires. The lack of information on umpire performance provided by some captains is disappointing, however detailed comments received from the majority of captains assists us to better the standard of umpiring. Two Luscombe Shield captains regularly provide fully detailed umpire assessments – thanks John Markham (Buckley Park) and Cameron Hare (Pascoe Vale Central).

Issues Arising in 2014/15

Over-rates: Discrepancy in over-rates was regularly raised by umpires. Many teams bowl overs ahead of the time allocated, but other teams regularly finish unacceptably late. This is a problem for both umpires and captains to address?

Player behaviour: Mid-season, the NWMCA Board expressed concern at an apparent increase in instances of player misbehaviour being unreported by umpires. After umpires received strong direction on the issue the number of players placed on Caution Reports accelerated dramatically.

Payment of umpire fees: Following a succession of instances when umpires were not paid (seniors and juniors), the NWMCA Board satisfactorily resolved the problem by directing all fees must be paid prior to the start of play each day.

Most Improved Umpire Award

The Umpires' Association presented to **Michael Van Esch** the Most Improved Umpire award. Michael completed his third umpiring season and his improvement from previous seasons was dramatic – by round 10 he was upgraded to Luscombe Shield matches where his excellent reports continued. Well done Michael – a reward earned for perseverance.

NWCA Umpires' Association Meetings:

Allan Taylor (Pres), Brian Hedger (Secretary) and Michael Nolan (Treasurer) administered the affairs of the NWMCA Umpires' Association. The Association again displayed strong administration and the meetings were attended by a high percentage of panel umpires each month.

Umpire training on Laws/Rules and techniques is conducted at the Association's monthly meetings. Match appointments favour umpires attending meetings.

At the December "Christmas" Meeting umpires were entertained by former Australian player **Merv Hughes.** A lively evening listening to Merv's legendary stories and his personal thoughts on cricket at all levels. He impressed upon all our umpires to continue with their NWMCA umpiring role to benefit NWMCA cricket.

Working With Children Check (WWC)

All NWMCA Senior umpires hold the Department of Justice's WWC clearance. Allan Taylor again administered this program to ensure compliance by all adult umpires.

ACB Accreditation

NWMCA rules require all NWMCA umpires (seniors and juniors) to qualify for at least the ACB Level 1 Umpiring Accreditation. This year, ACB upgraded to an on-line computerised Level 1 course. Disappointingly, the computer program failed to satisfy the needs of participants. We were fortunate NWMCA had already conducted the full manual course for new umpires to cover the inability of the ACB program to issue Level 1 Accreditation.

VMCU Carnival Matches

VMCU representative matches were umpired by Gordon Andrews, Sunil Gupta, Brian Joiner, Peter Ryan, Allan Taylor and Phil Winduss.

Allan Taylor provided a highlight for NWMCA with appointment by the VMCU as the metropolitan umpire in the VMCU v VCCL Under 21 Grand Final. A major honour for NWMCA.

Under-Age grades Panel

The Junior Panel commenced the season with in excess of 80 umpires – a record number, although a significant proportion of these were not available by season's end.

The increase in numbers resulted from 43 umpires returning from season 2013/14 – a high retention rate for the juniors, (most likely due to an increase in umpire fees for the Under-Age Panel).

Umpires available for appointment to Friday night matches exceeded the number of games available.

Under Age Umpire Award – Terry Scott Medal Ryan Gutbier was adjudged the best Under Age umpire. Ryan umpired his first season of under Age matches and with consistently very good reports from coaches rapidly progressed to the Under 16 Grades before umpiring the under 16A McCabe Shield Grand Final. Ryan also officiated in the VMCU carnival.

VMCU Carnival Matches

We again received special VMCU permission for our junior umpires to umpire VMCU representative matches. Umpires appointed were: Thomas Addison, Jarryd Clements, Ryan Gutbier, Billy Iles, Shane Mallia, Nil Shah and Cameron West.

The side that represented the NWMCA Jim Bietzel Shield had a successful carnival in terms of individual efforts, teams efforts, and representing the association in a strong and sportsman like manner. The side was selected after a long trial process, that allowed players to develop and begin to work to the game plans and styles that would be expected in the carnival. The teams were given certain goals to achieve in each game when batting and bowling, and took these on well understanding what achievements were pivotal to team success.

Round 1 vs Gisborne & District CA

Game 1 saw a great start from our boys against one of the weaker sides for the carnival. After sending Gisborne in, we were able to apply pressure early with a low run rate, and although the top order got starts, the boys stuck at it eventually dismissing them for 122 after 43.4 overs. Shared wickets were key, as well as a string fielding effort by all. In reply we batted the overs to finish on 5/203 with Cafari getting a strong 84.

Round 2 vs Wester Region Junior CA

Game 2 was transferred to a synthetic ground due to the WRJCA ground being wet. We won the toss and finished with 8/196, a strong effort on a slow, large ground. Bibby played a hard fought and gutsy 76, and others chipped in when needed. In reply WRJCA batted the overs out to be 9/165, including a 56 not out last wicket stand. Was fair to say the boys let the foot off the pedal, and all had a bit to say about the disappointment in that, which was good to see what they were aspiring to achieve. Wickets were again shared.

Round 3 vs Box Hill Reporter District CA

Game 3 was played at our home ground against one of the top opposition. A damp wicket again showed some importance in winning the toss which we managed to do and had a field first, dismissing box hill for 84 after 44 overs. Luisetto stared with the ball taking 3 wickets, whilst Newnham was again economical with the new ball. In reply after a solid start we set the task to make the runs as quickly as possible due to expected rain. The total was chased after 27 overs, 3 wickets down, which included Luisetto being promoted up the order to score a quick 36 not out and Ricupero scoring 29 not out and batting through the innings.

Round 4 vs Southern District & Churches CL

Game 4 was known to be important with southern scoring strong wins in previous games just as we had. After dismissing them for 163 from 44 overs (Luisetto blowing tidy for 2/9 and Mathews picking up 3/17) the total was under our set mark. In reply the boys made every mistake they could've, not finding it difficult but with each lad walking off the ground disappointed in a false shot or mistake that could've been avoided. Only McGregor in the top order showed any resistance with 26, which the remaining top 6 batsman combined for only 11 runs and saw us dismissed for 110 after 43 overs.

Game 5 vs Ferntree Gully District CA

Game 5 was again against a tough opposition who had played well so far. Due to rain, and again our need to play (due to the loss and so many sides sitting on one loss or less) the game was moved to synthetic where we won the toss and bowled them out for 87 after 42 overs, with Mathew and Weightman our spin options proving to be the pick of the bowlers again taking 3 and 2 wickets on a day with a wet ball that was hard to grip for the seamers. At tea, the coaching staff and boys were left with a decision after a heavy down pour of rain. Play the day out and risk playing out a draw (due to only 25 overs allowed for us rather than 45) or come back tomorrow and bowl at Ferntree Gully again. The decision was made to chase the total in 25 overs. In reply we scored 69 after 23.5 overs with only 1 over left to play due to rain. This was our most hard fought and gutsy win of the carnival after the day's weather had basically conspired against us.

Vasilakakos scored 25.

We finished the group stage finishing 2nd, playing Eastern CA. The top 3 sides looked by far the strongest of the competition.

SF vs Eastern CA

After Doutta Stars not being able to provide a wicket due to covers not being down, the decision was again put to coaching staff to play on synthetic. After playing 2/5 group games on synthetic, the boys had already had limited experience on turf wickets for the carnival and the decision was made to play an away final at the Eastern CA home ground. A decision I think was made in the best interests of the playing group and their experience.

We were sent in to bad on a damp wicket, which was a toss we were use to winning throughout the carnival. We managed to scrape 68 after 35.5 overs with Vasilakakos 21 and Gandhi 18 not out providing the only for of resistance. Bowling, we knew we needed to take the game on and unfortunately luck didn't fall our way with a few early play and misses and Eastern passed us jn 23 overs. Overall, I think was a successful carnival for the NWMCA. Had we have won the game against South Churches in the group stages we would've finished on top and most likely had a grand final berth, however it was not to be and we were knocked out in the SF against the eventual premier in Eastern. I think all boys were given an opportunity to shine and produce efforts in areas they were picked in (bat, ball, wicket keeping).

After a long and difficult selection process, we finally settled on 13 players to take part in the Representative Carnival. We thought we had a good balance of batting, bowling and fielding to take us a long way into the carnival. We couldn't wait for the real stuff to begin after 3 practice matches late in December.

Round 1: Monday 5th January 2015 at JP Fawkner v Ringwood District

We played our first game at home against Ringwood District. They won the toss and elected to bat. We started really well with Jack and Dylan G. opening the bowling, Jack getting a wicket in his second over. The first change bowlers (Lachlan and Brenton 1 for 28 off 5) had them on the back foot at 3 for 32 with a wicket a piece. Ringwood steadied the ship after that taking the score to 120. Jack rotated the bowling around trying to break the partnership with Shan, Dominic, Mason and Liam bowling. Liam made a double break through taking 2 for 16 off 4. After a well-deserved lunch break, we commenced our run chase. Avidu and Dylan W opened. Dylan was caught for 4 (1/11) before Jamal steadied with a solid partnership of 29 before Jamal got caught for 3 (2/40). Mason (44 run out)) came to the crease and with Avidu, put on a partnership of 64 (3/104). Avidu (41 caught) fell shortly thereafter to have us on 4/109. Trying to lift the run rate, we lost a few wickets in short succession (5/123 – Brenton 12 run out), (6/134 – Jack 5 caught), (7/142 – Shan 14 caught), (8/143 – Dominic 2 caught) and (9/146 – Jesse 3 caught). Liam (10 not out) and Lachlan (0 not out) faced out the final over or 2 to leave us 22 runs shy (9/159 off 45) – not a bad first up game.

Round 2: Tuesday 6th Jan 2015 at Greythorn Park v Eastern

After a narrow loss in round 1, the boys were keen to get a win against a strong side in Eastern. We had a bad warm up with Dylan G pulling out with knee soreness. This made the decision of who we made 13th man easy. We lost the toss again and they sent us in to bat on what looked like a quick ground. We had a disastrous start losing both Avidu and Dylan W for ducks (2/0). Mason (15) and Jamal steadied for a little while before we were 4/26. Jack (7) and Dominic (5) faced out a few overs before they both fell with the score on 38 (6/38). Noah (10) in for his first game batted at 7 along with Lachlan (10) to leave us at 8/61. Shan (23 not out) and Jesse 31 added 48 valuable runs before losing our 9th wicket. Liam(5) joined Shan to add another 17 runs getting run out trying to steal another run on the last ball of our innings - all out for 126 – not a great score but a score we could try and defend.

After the break, we got an early wicket, with Lachlan 1/5 off 5 overs the pick of the bowlers. Other wicket takers were Jack 1/41 off 6, Dominic 2/18 off 4 and Dylan W 1/2 off 1. They passed us with 22 overs to spare and 5 wickets in hand. We certainly had some work to do to qualify for finals after losing the first 2 games but were not daunted at all.

Round 3: Wednesday 7th January 2015 at JP Fawkner v Diamond Valley

The boys were really keen to get a win on the board at home. We won the toss and sent them in. Jack and Dylan G opened the bowling. Jack (0/26 off 9) the leading wicket taker to date bowled extremely well but went wicketless. Dylan had his best figures for the tournament with 4/33 off 8. Most of the runs for these 2 came at the end when they were trying to score quick runs in the dying overs. Dylan W (1/21 off 5), Lim (2/16 off 5) and Lachlan (1/18 off 7) were the other wicket takers. Diamond Valley ended up on 8/166 off 45 – a score we were confident of getting.

After the break, we again started badly losing Dylan W (2), Mason (0), Dominic (2) to be 3 for 8. Avidu contributed a hard fought 16 runs leavings us at 4/38 before Shan (27) and Jack (39) steadied. We were travelling along nicely and looking great before the wheels fell off. We went from 4/90 to all out for 126 in the 40th over. Our top order was not consistent so we looked to make some changes for the next match.

Round 4: Friday 9th January 2015 at Whitehorse Reserve v Box Hill Reporter

In a rain shortened match, Box Hill Reporter won the toss and batted. They came out swinging and got away to a quick start with one of their openers getting a 50 in around 12 overs. After the fall of a couple of wickets, the run rate dried up with some excellent bowling from Shan (4/8 off 4), Lachlan (2/26 off 7), Mason (1/15 off 4), Dylan G (1/21 off 7) and Jack (2/30 off 8). We bowled them out for 154 on a quick deck on a smallish ground. We thought we were in it with only 4 runs required an over.

We had one of the better starts, losing Avidu (6) early on but Jamal (32) and Mason (23) making solid contributions. Due to a slow start, Jesse (15) and then Dylan G (0) were sent up the order to score quick runs. A late stanza from Shan (28 not out) and Jack (21) nearly saw us get over the line. Dominic (1), Brenton (10 and Noah (14 not out) added great support to Shan. We fell 1 agonizingly run short of a memorable win on a day when most teams did not play.

Round 5: Monday 12th January 2015 at JP Fawkner v South East

This was our last chance to win a game and qualify for finals and we were going to give it everything we had. South East was the team to beat, having won all their games and beating us in a practice match in December. South East won the toss and sent us in. We started badly again losing both openers Avidu (5) and Jamal (0) to be 2 for 23 off around 10 overs. A couple of great partnerships between Mason (44), Jack (39) and Shan(46) with great support from Dylan W (4), Jesse (3) and Noah (16 not out) saw us accumulate our highest score for the competition to date of 8/168 off our 45 overs.

Confidence was running high when we resumed from the break. Jack (1/28 off 9) bowled well, however his opening partner Dylan G broke down after 1 over and took no further part in the game. They batted really well and took the game away from us. The other bowlers to get wickets were Dominic (1/21 off 5), Noah (1/27 off 6) and Shan (1/17 off 4). They passed our score with 11 overs still to go and deserved to finish on top.

Conclusion

I would like to thank all the parents and helpers who helped set up the ground, made the cold drinks and beautiful lunches. I would especially like to thank Azzam (Azza) for being the team manager – a thankless task and he did an excellent job. I would also like to thank my assistant coach Darren (Spud) Nagle for providing great assistance on selections of the team (we had to make 1 player every game a 13th man – could only field, and make another a designated batter or bowler. This was the most difficult task every game.

The players tried their hardest in each and every game, falling a little short on each occasion. They may not have won a game, however their spirits were high and it was a pleasure to coach them for the carnival. I wish them all the very best of success in their cricket careers and look forward to seeing how far they go.
