It is with mixed feelings that I present my final report to this Annual General Meeting. I have really enjoyed my time as your CEO for the past 12 seasons and before that as Vice-President for 3 seasons and Board member since 1984. This Association has been a major part of my life for well over 30 years and I am sorry to be leaving but I realise that we must all give way to youth and I hope that they enjoy their service to you, the member clubs, as much as I have.

The Board has appointed Phil Rigg to handle the administrative duties; Bob Byron will assume the Executive responsibilities and Ms Kris Maulden will handle the finance. I know you will give these people your utmost support.

NWCA has had another great season with 47 Clubs fielding over 4,000 players encompassing 7 municipalities, and embracing competitions for Under 10s right through to the Veterans. This year we welcomed Burnside Springs to the NWCA who joined us after a few seasons in the Western Suburban Churches competition and Youlden Parkville who competed in the junior competition.

This season was marked by many interruptions because of rain, a sight that has been very scarce in Melbourne over the past 8 years or so. Quite a lot of matches, particularly in the junior grades were cancelled and this has had a flow-on effect with many clubs reporting reduced numbers and reduced revenues.

Our Presentation Night held at Melrose Receptions on 8th April was a success with good attendances from the senior clubs. This year we used a slightly different format with the guest speaker comedian, Ben Lomas, doubling as MC. He did a great job as MC and held the audience quite well with his humour. The night was complimented by an excellent meal, a great PowerPoint presentation and fine music from DJ, Rob Arnold.

At the Presentation Night we also inducted into the 300 Club Ian "Possum" Ross from Buckley Park who has played over 300 senior games with NWCA and EBKCA. We look forward to receiving further nominations from member clubs in the future as their players reach this milestone in their careers.

Congratulations to Pascoe Vale Central for winning back to back George Luscombe Shields after an effortless win over Buckley Park.

Brett Barron from Pascoe Vale Central was named Man of the Match because of his outstanding bowling efforts. Brett was presented with the "Ian McCann" medallion at the ground by Ian McCann himself who was able to attend this year's match despite poor health.

However, Buckley Park was successful and congratulations to them for winning the Luscombe-Gibbs One-Day Championship Shield for the first time with an emphatic win over the red hot favourites, Sydenham/Hillside. Buckley Park collected the prize of \$1,000 donated by the Pascoe Vale Central Cricket Club, Terry Bailey from Sydenham/Hillside collected the Graham Muir Medal and the \$250 cash prize for being Player of the Match. Many thanks to Graham Muir for your support; it is greatly appreciated by all.

This year the Luscombe-Gibbs Grand Final which is held in conjunction with the *Red and Black Club* reunion was hosted by Pascoe Vale Central. They put on a superb luncheon and a real treat for the assembled guests was an address from their former player and now Australian Test representative Clint McKay. The Board thanks Pascoe Vale Central CC, Paul McCann and all the committee for their fine efforts.

Sydenham/Hillside was successful in winning the Keith Stringer Shield; Campbellfield won the Graham Muir Shield; Greenvale won the NWCA Shield; Gladstone Park won the Ralph Barron Shield; Craigieburn won the Barrie Clissold Shield in fine style and Pascoe Vale Central won the Legends Shield Premiership. In the One-Day Grades premierships were won by St Mary's and Jacana, and Airport West won the Veterans.

The Grand Final of the Twenty20 was won by Jacana who easily defeated Taylors Lakes. Jacana will now go on to represent NWCA in the VB T20 Region 10 play-offs next season.

This year we were fortunate to be able to play two representative matches against Moreland Moonee Valley Cricket Association. The senior team was ably led by Dean Erdman and they were untroubled to beat MMVCA. Scores NWCA 9/157 d MMVCA 10/75. The Veterans team was very ably led by Steven Knight but with no success. The veterans fielded a team from the old EBKCA turf teams and we saw many well known names from the past perform quite creditably but their wonderful efforts were not reflected on the scoreboard. Scores NWCA 10/64 def by MMVCA 10/195.

Under the guidance of the Junior Committee our Junior competition continues to thrive. However, numbers were down this year which appears to be a Melbourne-wide phenomenon. Well done to the boys that competed so ably in the Mitchell Shield, Russell Allen Shield, Des Nolan and the Jim Beitzell Shield teams. The success of this VMCU Carnival held in January each year is evident by the growing interest from players and their parents throughout Melbourne.

I thank all Board members for all their tireless work during the last season.

The expense of maintaining a Not-for-Profit organisation like NWCA are quite high and our ability to continue to offer a competitive cost structure would not have been possible without the very generous support of our wonderful sponsors. Without them it would be extremely difficult to operate as successfully as we do and we thank them for the participation in Melbourne's major cricket Association

UNDER 16 VMCU BEITZEL SHIELD REPORT

The Beitzel Shield team came about after a number of training sessions conducted with high numbers and a hard work ethic.

The first assignment of the carnival saw the boys travel out to the picturesque Donvale Reserve where we were greeted with a magnificent outfield and rock-hard wicket. Our plans were thrown around with an injury to fast bowler Paul Elmadi on the eve of the game along with the delayed arrival of our Papua New Guinea pocket rocket Dogodo Bau, due to his postponed flight back from his Christmas holiday in his native land. Eastern CA recovered from a slow start to post a moderate total of 5-159 off their 45. Daniel Brown captured 2-21 off 7 overs and new-ball bowler Tom Petersen was the pick of the bowlers ending up with an economical 1-23 off 9. The highlight of the innings was a magnificent outfield catch to Joel Costello. We were in trouble early when both of our openers departed within the first 9 overs to see us 2/16. It turned out to be a blessing in disguise as Daniel Bottomley joined skipper Salv Scodella at the crease to put together a stunning partnership of 139, taking us only 7 runs shy of the target until Salv was run out for a great captain's knock of 73. Bottomley ended up 65 not out. The concentration and class shown by the pair was outstanding and we hoped it would provide a great springboard for the rest of the carnival.

The second day saw us hosting Diamond Valley CA. We were sent in to bat, and after a slow start managed to accumulate a total of 7/145, which was very defendable on the lush surrounds of Ormond Park. Joel Costello was the pick of the batsmen, compiling 53 runs in a determined & composed knock spanning 34 overs. Bottomley (22), Luke Rainone (19) and Jake Nettleton (22) all provided quick-fire cameos to help give our bowlers something to bowl at. DVCA cruised through the first half of their innings to be 2/76 after 23. We managed to slow the run-rate successfully thereafter but couldn't get the breakthroughs required to get over the line, with the opposition reaching our total for the loss of 3 wickets, but with only 4 balls to spare, which underlined our nature to fight until the end. One wicket each to Bau, Nettleton & Cam DeCruze.

The might of Dandenong District CA travelled to Ormond Park for Day 3 action. With the outfield given a trim just prior to the match, more runs were on the menu than the previous day. Salv won the toss and elected to bat. There were fireworks right from the start as Nathaniel Biggs and Luke Rainone formed a lethal opening stand of 72 off 13 overs before the dashing Biggs was dismissed for a whirlwind 52, showing our more fancied opponents exactly what he is capable of. Rainone fell shortly after for a well-compiled 22. Bau and Bottomley proved to be a stylish combination, amassing 81 runs in just under 20 overs. Bottomley exited on 22, with Bau dominating the partnership (and the bowlers) to end up 72 not out, with very elegant shots all over the ground. A few quick wickets going the tonk at the end meant we finished 5/182, providing a very good platform for the afternoon session. Dandenong shot out of the blocks and unfortunately managed to maintain a very good scoring rate throughout their innings as we were powerless to stem the flow of runs. They ended up only losing 2 wickets in the chase that endured 42 overs, underlining the skill amongst their ranks and showing us why they ended up the eventual champions of the carnival. Jake Nettleton snared both wickets in a good display of seam bowling with the new ball. The positive to come out of the day was that we racked up the highest score of all of Dandenong's opponents for the tournament.

We came back refreshed after the weekend break and made the trek to take on Moorabbin. The boys were ultra-determined to get one back on the opposition after they defeated us quite comfortably in the practice match a few weeks earlier. The match was reduced to 39 overs per side due to a morning rain delay. Moorabbin elected to bat first on a wicket that looked like it would give the seamers plenty of assistance. However, our boys didn't make as many inroads as they'd have liked early on, meaning Moorabbin were firmly in the driver's seat at 3-83 off 24 overs. Well someone didn't tell that to the North West boys as they managed to set the game alight with an inspired burst of 7-16 off 11 overs to skittle the once-cocky enemy for 99. Bowling honours were shared around in the even performance, DeCruze (2/8), Bau (2/11), Petersen (2/20). Things weren't looking so good when the Redbacks stumbled to 4/33 in the 17th over, although it wasn't through a lack of trying by opening batsman Jesse Vasilas, who made a

gutsy 20 on a sticky surface. The game was right in the balance at this stage and Daniel Bottomley & Luke Rainone (12) set about closing the gap ball by ball. They put on an extremely valuable 29 runs under considerable pressure before Biggs came to the crease and whittled the score down quick smart with a vast array of strokes and superb running between the wickets. Impressive 'team' batting by the duo, with Bottomley finishing 27 not out and Biggs an unbeaten 20. A very satisfying day for all concerned!!!

Two wins and two losses meant we were keen to finish the carnival in the positive with a victory on the last day. We hosted Ferntree Gully CA, who won the toss and elected to bat on a wintry day which comprised a handful of rain delays. Despite us being able to get wickets at fairly regular intervals, Ferntree Gully were still able to score at a reasonable rate and ended up being dismissed for 162 in the penultimate over. The pick of the bowlers once again was Jake Nettleton who claimed

3/38, with 4 other individual wicket-takers and 3 tidy run-outs. The early momentum of the 2nd innings went the way of Ferntree Gully as our openers were dismissed for single figures. Bau & DeCruze took advantage of their promotions up the order but weren't able to convert their starts, falling for 18 & 25 respectively. A middle-order collapse saw the NWCA delicately placed at 5/76 until Scodella joined Nettleton to put on a rapid 44 to bring the Redbacks back into contention. When Scodella departed for 13 and Nettleton fell shortly after for a brilliant 43, Ferntree Gully capitalised and were able to bowl us out for 140. A disappointing way to end the carnival but nevertheless a very enriching fortnight for everyone involved. Every player gave his utmost and represented the Association with a great attitude and determination. Thanks to all involved.

After a pre Xmas practice and a post New Year warm up at our home ground, Ormond Park, the boys were ready.
